COMMUNITIES & CLIMATE SMART COMMUNITIES CERTIFICATION PROGRAM

Mr. Niklas Moran of Hudson Valley Regional Council was present and provided an information packet to the Town Board that outlines ten actions that the Town could do to implement clean energy use. This program is supported by NYSERDA and recognizes local governments for clean energy leadership. If the Town completes four actions out of the ten, the Town could be eligible to apply for grants to fund additional clean energy projects. Deputy Administrator Chester suggested that the next action to look at would be benchmarking to save energy in buildings. The Electric Vehicle Charging Stations are being installed in the Town Hall Parking Lot tomorrow, 09/20/2017.

#### 3) STREETLIGHT REQUEST - MOONLIGHT COTTAGES, MONTICELLO

Avi Muchnick on behalf of Moonlight Cottages had requested an additional streetlight near 60 Rubin Road, Monticello. Supervisor Rieber has discussed this with Highway Superintendent Benjamin. It is the Town's policy that streetlights are to be located at

intersections of Town Roads. All other locations are the responsibility of the property owner. Moonlight Cottages entrance is a private road. Supervisor Rieber advised Mr. Muchnick of this and Mr. Muchnick replied he understood and thanked the Town for taking the time to address his request.

#### 6) SULLIVAN COUNTY TONNAGE ALLOTMENT

Supervisor Rieber stated that he spoke with Ira Steingart, Sullivan County Legislator to ask of the remaining 8.8 tons from the Spring Clean Up Program could be used towards the cleanup of the Town Park Pavilion Demolition. The County verbally agreed that this will be permitted and they may be able to accommodate the Town with a lower rate.

#### 7) KIAMESHA LAKE SEWER DISTRICT

Supervisor Rieber stated that this project is a new one and there were previous discussions on whether the Town wanted to get RFP's for different engineering. Councilman Pavese asked if the engineering could be put out for proposals so other firms could have the opportunity for the work. Water & Sewer Superintendent Messenger said this project is consent order work which came from a study that McGoey Hauser & Edsall Consulting Engineers has already done and they have been in front of the Planning Board with aspects of the project. Water & Sewer Superintendent Messenger agrees with Councilman Pavese with engineering RFP's for some projects, but not for this particular project.

Water & Sewer Superintendent Messenger stated that this project could be \$1.4 to \$1.5 million. There is almost 4,000 feet of sewer line that was put in sometime in the late 1950's and early 1960's. Supervisor Rieber stated that this project will have to be bonded. The Town is looking at \$50,000 to \$60,000 in engineering fees before the project is started. Water & Sewer Superintendent Messenger stated that there are funds left over from the Stockbridge Munsee Infiltration Work.

Park Manager Somers advised the Board that Dog Control Officer Nancy Marinchak visited the site and was very pleased with the area.
