Supt. Messenger also reported he is trying to obtain bids/proposals for concrete work for the Dillon Farms Well House Replacement Project.

Superintendent Somers reported that he contacted Cintas to obtain prices to provide mats/rugs for the Town Hall. The cost would be \$46.71 per week and \$2,428.92 per year. The company would provide the Town Hall with the rugs and change/replace them on a weekly basis. This would help to keep them clean and to preserve the new carpeting/flooring in the Town Hall. There would be a total of (10) mats/rugs provided. Further discussion ensued regarding this matter and Councilman Pavese and Mace will obtain other prices/options for mats/rugs before making final decision. Supt. Somers also reported that he spoke with Highway Supt. Benjamin regarding repaving of the Town Hall Parking Lot. Supt. Benjamin is recommending that bad sections be repaired and then be striped and sealed. The Highway Department will make the necessary repairs/patching prior to having it striped and sealed. Supt. Somers will obtain prices to stripe and seal the entire Town Hall Parking Lot.
