  - Melody Lake Water Hydropneumatic tank has a hole and repairs have been unable to stop slow leak. Replace with new pump and VFD to maintain constant pressure. Pump/VFD would work with new well house when built. Estimated to be \$7,000.00 for project. Discussed well house funding. Engineer Matthew Sickler recommends USDA funding.
  - Harris Pump Station Need new well for pumps and valves.
  - Emerald Green WWTP Automatic Valves are beginning to fail. Need major upgrade of mechanicals within the plant.
  - Dillon Farms Water Provided update regarding the well house project status.

Local Law No. 10 of the year 2018

A local law to amend Chapter 250 of the Town of Thompson Code relating to zoning and planned unit development

Be it enacted by the Town Board of the

Town of Thompson

1. Chapter 250 of the Code of the Town of Thompson entitled "Zoning and Planned Unit Development", is hereby amended to reclassify the following described real property which is currently classified on the zoning map of the Town of Thompson in the Suburban Residential (SR) district:

Only that portion of real property identified on the Town of Thompson Tax Map as parcel SBL 31-1-56, consisting of approximately 4.82 acres, currently zoned as Suburban Residential (SR), shall be reclassified on such zoning map as Highway Commercial-2 (HC-2) and shall hereafter be subject to the schedule of district regulations for such Highway Commercial-2 (HC-2) zone.

- 2. Except as herein specifically amended, the remainder of Chapter 250 of such code shall remain in full force and effect.
- 3. If any clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, section or part thereof this local law shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgment, decree

or order shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder thereof but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, section or part thereof directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment, decree or order shall have been rendered and the remainder of this local law shall not be affected thereby and shall remain in full force and effect.

- 4. Except as herein otherwise provided penalties for the violation of this local law, any person committing an offense against any provision of the chapter of the Code of the Town of Thompson shall, upon conviction thereof, be punishable as provided in Chapter 1, General Provisions, Article II, of such Code.
- 5. This local law shall take effect immediately.

# 2. NOB HILL COUNTRY CLUB, INC.: REVIEW & DISCUSS DEVELOPER'S AGREEMENT AND FORMATION OF SEWER-WORKS CORPORATION AND WATER-WORKS CORPORATION

There was a discussion held between the Town Board, Town Attorney Mednick, Attorney Jay Zeiger on behalf of Nob Hill Country Club, Inc. and Water & Sewer Superintendent Messenger regarding the formation of the Sewer-Works Corporation and Water-Works Corporation as well as the Developer's Agreement. There are concerns regarding the formation of either a Sewer-Works Corporation or a Water-Works Corporation. The Town suggested that the property owner build the sewer line to Town Specifications and dedicate to the Town for the sewer service in the Town Sewer District and there would be no need to form a Sewer-Works Corporation. The Water service is provided by Kiamesha Artesian Water, a private water company. Attorney Zeiger said he thinks that the only thing the Town would take over if ever necessary would be the shared waterline including the maintenance and repairs of the waterline and not the supply. Attorney Zeiger will obtain clarification regarding the issue. The concerns regarding the water service will be discussed with the NYS DOH prior to proceeding. In regards to the proposed Developer's Agreement, plans for the proposed development project were provided and reviewed. The Developer would like to start site work that would encompass water and sewer infrastructure as soon as possible while the other issues are being worked-out. A performance and restoration bond will be provided to the Town. The Developer acknowledges the risk involved by commencing the site work at this time.

# DISCUSSION: CONSIDER APPROVAL TO CLOSE OUT ADELAAR INFRASTRUCTURE CONSTRUCTION PROJECT BID PACKAGES A, B & F

Supervisor Rieber reported on conversations regarding the Adelaar Infrastructure Construction Project Bid Packages A-F. Major Bid Packages A, B & F are ready to be closed out.

- Bid Package A for major construction of roads and sewer has been balanced out. McGoey, Hauser and Edsall Consulting Engineers DPC are okay with Bid Package A and have been fair on the other overages. There were some small overages, but nothing substantial considering the scope of the project.
- Bid Package B was for the waterline crossing, which took additional time.
   Supervisor Rieber proposed to close out A, B and F Bid Packages with Adelaar agreeing to pay the actual cost of the inspections of Bid Package B that were in excess of the original estimate, which is around \$185,000.00. The Town would bill EPR for the final payments on Bid Package B.

 Bid Package F for wetlands mitigation work actually went over the estimate; however the engineering fees originally collected were more than sufficient to cover the cost for that job. Everyone has been paid on Bid Package F.

Bid Packages A and F would be closed out with no additional funds due. All three Bid Packages A, B & F would be closed out with EPR paying a small balance due of approximately \$10,000.00 less funds that are left in and deducted from escrow. This way all three of the bid packages can be closed out before the end of the year. The Town actually has funds in both bid package A escrow and bid package B escrow, which is approximately \$100,000.00, that is retained for the Towns overhead administration costs that will be transferred into the General A Fund. This would zero out the escrow accounts for bid packages A and B. Once closed out, the transfer of those funds will be presented for approval at the next Town Board meeting. EPR would pay an additional \$10,000.00 out of pocket expenses to cover bid package B. Then this will zero out bid packages A, B and F and can close all three out.

### The Following Resolution Was Duly Adopted: Res. No. 418 of the Year 2018.

Resolved, that the Town Board of the Town of Thompson hereby authorizes the close out of the Adelaar Infrastructure Construction Project for Bid Packages A, B and F to be considered sufficient for the Town's purposes and for inspection purposes. Further Be It Resolved, that Bid Package B closeout is subject to final payments by EPR Properties.
