Notice of Order 11 48.20 (bf), as enclosed, establishes 30 MPH on Resorts World Drive (TH 206) between Thompson Road and Joyland Road (TH 60) a distance of 0.3 +/- mile.

The New York State Department of Transportation(NYSDOT), being the agency having principle responsibility for carrying out or approving the project, is the lead agency pursuant to Part 15 of Title 17 of the Official Compilation of Codes, Rules and Regulations of the New York State (17 NYCRR Part 15).

This project involves the replacement of 5 culverts spread across Chenango, Delaware, and Sullivan Counties. This project is a NEPA Class II Action (Categorical Exclusion) and because the project does not meet the criteria for SEQRA Type II projects/actions found in 17 NYCRR Part 15.14, Section (d) (6) it is considered a SEQRA Non-Type II action.
