 2019 in Review

Annual Water Quality Report Kiamesha Artesian Spring Water Co. Town of Thompson ID No: 5203344

Drinking water provided for public use may originate from several sources including rivers, lakes, streams, ponds, reservoirs, springs and wells. As water travels over the surface of the land or through the ground, it dissolves naturally occurring minerals, and may also pick up substances resulting from the presence of animals, or from human activity. All of these materials are generally considered contaminants, and may be classified as microbes, pesticides and herbicides, radioactive, inorganic or organic chemicals.

The Kiamesha Artesian Spring Water Co. water supply, which consists of approximately four hundred and ten service connections, originates from two sources; A) the plant drilled well about one hundred fifty feet deep, and B) the Kiamesha Lake surface water. A second drilled well is located near Frazer Road, but has not been in use.

The New York State Department of Health has completed a source water assessment for this water system, based on available information. Possible and actual threats to this drinking water source were evaluated. The state source water assessment includes a susceptibility rating based on the risk posed by each potential source of contamination and how easily contaminants can move through the subsurface to the wells. The susceptibility rating is an estimate of the potential for contamination of the source water, it does not mean that the water delivered to consumers is, or will be, contaminated. The purpose of source water assessments is to provide resource managers with additional information for protecting source waters in the future.

As mentioned previously in this report, our drinking water is derived from one drilled well. The source water assessment has rated this well as having a medium high to high susceptibility to enteric bacteria, halogenated solvents, herbicides/pesticides, metals, nitrates, petroleum products, and other industrial organics. These ratings are due primarily to the close proximity of permitted discharge facilities (industrial/commercial facilities that discharge wastewater into the environment and are regulated by the State and/or Federal government) and a high intensity commercial zone in relation to the well. In addition the well draws from an unconfined aquifer of unknown hydraulic conductivity and chemical contamination has been documented. Please note that this report only details the possibility for contamination. Our water is tested regularly to ensure that the finished water coming into your home meets New York State drinking water standards.

The source water assessment for the lake supply found an elevated susceptibility to contamination for this source of drinking water. Land cover and its associated activities within the assessment area increase the potential for contamination. There is a high density of sanitary wastewater discharges, which results in an elevated susceptibility for all contaminate categories. Other potential sources of contamination include roadways and a golf course. While lakes are not generally considered to have a high natural sensitivity to phosphorus, the lake currently has algae problems.

County and state health departments will use this information to direct future source water protection activities. These may include water quality monitoring, resource management, planning, and education programs. A copy of the assessment, including a map of the assessment area can be obtained by contacting us as noted below.

In order to ensure that tap water is safe to drink, the Environmental Protection Agency prescribes regulations which limit the amount of certain contaminants in water provided by public water systems. Likewise, the Food and Drug Administration establishes limits for contaminants in bottled water, providing the same protection for public health. State regulations further establish maximum contaminant levels (MCL), as well as minimum monitoring or testing requirements, depending on each contaminant. Drinking water, including bottled water, may reasonably be expected to contain at least small amounts of some contaminants. It should be noted that the presence of contaminants does not necessarily indicate that water poses a health risk.

Dependent on regulations and/or test results of analyses conducted, public water supplies may be treated by processes of filtration, disinfection, or treatment additives prior to delivery to customers.

The Kiamesha Artesian Spring Water Co. surface source undergoes filtration processes, as well as receiving treatment by a chlorination system. The drilled well is also treated by a chlorination system to ensure bacteriologically safe, potable water. The two sources are commingled prior to distribution to the various service points. Water processed at the treatment plant also undergoes a treatment additive for corrosion control.

Some people may be more vulnerable to disease causing microorganisms or pathogens in drinking water than the general population. Immuno-compromised persons such as persons with cancer undergoing chemotherapy, persons who have undergone organ transplants, people with HIV/AIDS or other immune system disorders, some elderly, and infants may be particularly at risk from infections. These people should seek advice from their health care providers.

The Kiamesha Artesian Spring Water Co. routinely undergoes analyses for nitrates, inorganics, volatile organics, synthetic organics and bacteriological quality. Testing of the water system for compliance with the New York State Department of Health regulations has been completed for 2019 and copies of the results have been submitted to the regulatory agency in a timely manner. Test results of contaminants monitored prior to 2019 may be obtained by contacting your representative, Alan Schachnovsky (845)794-4265, or the New York State Department of Health (845)794-2045.

The following table outlines which contaminants were detected in your drinking water. The State allows the monitoring for certain contaminants less than once per year because the concentrations of these contaminants are not expected to vary significantly from year to year. Therefore some of the data, though representative of the water quality, is more than one year old.



SEWER DISTRICT EXTENSION AGREEMENT

Agreement entered into as of the ___ day of June, 2020, between the Town of Thompson, a municipal corporation (the "Town"), acting on behalf of the Cold Spring Sewer District (the "District"), having its principal place of business at 4052 Route 42, Monticello, New York 12701 and Leisure Acres Summer Homes, LLC, a New York limited liability company having its principal place of business at 1563 57th Street, Brooklyn, New York 11219 ("Leisure").

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, Leisure is the Owner of three parcels of property in the Town, that being 29.-2-23, 29.-2-13, and 29.-2-22 (collectively the "Property"); and

WHEREAS, Leisure desires to develop the Property as a residential community of approximately 60 homes (the "Development"); and

WHEREAS, in furtherance of the Development, Leisure has petitioned the Town to extend the boundaries of the District to include the Property; and

WHEREAS, in order for the Town to extend the boundaries of the District to include the Property the Town requires permission from the Village of Monticello (the "Village"); and

WHEREAS, the Village has consented to allow the Town to extend the boundaries of the District to include the Property, subject to certain conditions, one of which is the condition that the District have individual water meters installed on each residence within the District at the expense of the District (the "Condition"); and

WHEREAS, the Town is willing to agree to the Condition only if Leisure agrees to pay all costs and expenses in order to satisfy the Condition; and

WHEREAS, the Town estimates that the costs and expenses to satisfy the condition will be no more than \$75,000.00; and

WHEREAS, Leisure has agreed to pay the costs and expenses, subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement;

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties hereto agree as follows:

- 1. The Town agrees to extend the boundaries of the District to include the Property and the proposed Development.
- 2. Leisure agrees to pay all costs and expenses of the Town applicable to the District extension, including Town engineer costs.

- 3. Leisure agrees to pay all costs and expenses of the Town in order to install the water meters as required by the Village (i.e., to satisfy the Condition). To secure said obligations of Leisure, Leisure agrees that upon execution of this Agreement, it will deposit with the Town the sum of \$75,000.00, which sum the Town may use to pay costs and expenses to satisfy the Condition. At such time as the Condition has been satisfied, any balance remaining of said \$75,000.00 shall be refunded to Leisure. To the extent that said sum of \$75,000.00 as inadequate to satisfy the Condition, Leisure shall advance the additional funds to the Town, as needed.
- 4. It is anticipated that the owner of one or more additional parcels will petition the Town to allow for a further extension of the boundaries of the District to include such additional parcels, including the owner of parcels 29.-1-22.1, 29.-1-24, and 29.-1-25.1 (collectively the "Additional Parcels"). The parties hereto agree that the owner(s) of the Additional Parcels shall share the cost of satisfying the Condition. To accomplish the foregoing, to the extent that any Additional Parcels are brought into the District the Town shall collect from the owner of each Additional Parcel a proportionate share of the amounts paid by Leisure to satisfy the Condition, as set forth in Paragraph "3" of this Agreement. For this purpose, the proportionate share shall be determined based upon the number of houses within the Leisure development as compared to the number of houses included within the Additional Parcels. Upon collection of such funds, to the extent that Leisure has paid more than its proportionate share the Town shall reimburse Leisure for the excess paid by Leisure. The obligation of the Town pursuant to this paragraph is limited only to payment to Leisure of amounts so collected by the Town; to the extent that no Additional Parcels are brought into the District, then the Town shall have no obligation to pay any such funds to Leisure, and nothing in this Agreement is intended to obligate the Town to add any Additional Parcels to the District. If Additional Parcels come into the District at different times, payments by the developers of subsequent Additional Parcels shall pay their proportionate share of the cost to satisfy the Condition, which payment shall be refunded to Leisure and any other developers who have paid shares. Amounts refunded shall be calculated by the Town on a prorata basis. Refunds to prior developers shall be by check to the developer's entities or assigns. No allowance will be given for interest or time value of any sort; checks to developers that are not negotiated will be voided and the funds will become the property of the District. Requests for reissuance of checks will be honored for 1 year from the date of issue of the original check, less service and stop payment fees, if applicable. It shall be the responsibility of the developers to make the Town aware of their current contact information and, if the entity changes or is dissolved, to provide the Town with an appropriate assignment of the right to receive future payments together with updated contact information and payment instructions. This agreement for reimbursement of the costs to satisfy the Condition shall expire 7 years from the date of full execution of this Agreement, except with respect to those projects, if any, which are first presented to the Town Planning Board or to the Town Board on or before the expiration of such 7 year period; with respect to said projects, this Agreement shall continue to be applicable until such time as the project is abandoned or the developer pays its share of the costs to satisfy the Condition and the Town makes its payments to Leisure and any other developer entitled to reimbursement as provided for herein.
