This document was submitted in accordance with a schedule of compliance in the SPDES Permit.

By initiating construction of this project, the permittee, owner and/or operator accepts and agrees to abide by and conform to the following conditions:

- (1) **THAT** the facilities shall be operated in compliance with State Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (SPDES) permit No. NY0030724 for the Kiamesha Lake WWTP.
- (2) **THAT** this approval letter and conditions, and the approved submissions be kept on file by the permittee, owner and/or operator.
- (3) **THAT** any and all construction undertaken shall be completely and wholly at the risk of the permittee. DEC does not assume any responsibility for reliance on the PE Certification. It is the applicant and the design engineer's responsibility to ensure that the system conforms to acceptable design standards and that it will function properly.
- (4) **THAT** this office is to be notified in writing at least one week prior to the date construction begins.

Petitioner KROEGER USA LLC, which is controlled by Yoel Yidel Weiss as Managing Member, by its attorneys Blustein, Shapiro, Frank & Barone, LLP, who are authorized to submit this Petition on behalf of Petitioner, pursuant to Article XIII of Chapter 250 of the Town Code of the Town of Thompson Code (the "Town Code") and § 265 of the Town Law of the State of New York (the "Town Law"), respectfully petition the Town Board for an amendment of the Zoning Map adopted pursuant to § 250-4 of the Town Code as follows:

- Pursuant to provisions of Article 16 of the Town Law, the Town adopted a

- 3. Petitioner is the owner of the properties identified on the Town Tax Map as Section 24., Block 1, Lots 31.2, 57, and 59.1 (the "Properties"). See Exhibit 2.

- 4. The Lots 57 and 59.1 are located in the Rural Residential-1 zoning district ("RR-1") and Lot 31.2 is located in the Highway Commercial-2 District ("HC-2"). See Exhibit 3 and Exhibit 4.
- 5. The Properties are unimproved, vacant lots. The Properties are contiguous to the Commercial Industrial zoning district ("CI") to the South and contiguous to the Highway Commercial-2 zoning district ("HC-2") to the East.
- 6. Petitioner submits that based on the information provided herein, the permitted uses in the CI district are more suitable for the development and use of the Properties. See Exhibit 5.
- 7. Petitioner submits that the area along Downs Road, while a portion may be used for emergency egress and ingress for the commercial project, those areas should remain in the RR-1 District.
- 8. 250 Attachment 6: Schedule of District Regulations, CI Commercial Industrial District provides for a maximum building height for warehouse and trucking terminals of 35 feet..
- 9. Petitioner submits, based on recent warehouse developments, that the maximum building height should be increased to 60 feet.
- 10. Petitioner hereby petitions the Town Board to amend the Zoning Map, as set forth above, changing the zoning district for the Properties from RR-1 and HC-2, respectively, to CI and change the maximum height for warehouse and trucking terminals in 250 Attachment 6: Schedule of District Regulations, CI Commercial Industrial District to 60 feet.



#### Dear Judge Gunther:

The Town of Thompson received the attached Notice of Small Claims Judgment in the above referenced matter dated February 15, 2024.

It is respectfully requested that the above-referenced Default Judgment be vacated. Initially, this matter was brought before the Town of Thompson Justice Court who declared a conflict and the matter was sent to the Sullivan County Court to assign the matter to a venue who could hear the matter. Neither the Town Clerk of the Town of Thompson nor the office of the Town Attorney were served with any Court Order or Notice of the change of venue to a new Court, as required pursuant to CPLR 2220. The Claimant/Plaintiff is required to file the Order with the Court and to serve the opposing party with Notice of Entry. To date, the Town has not seen the County Court Order changing venue as same was never served on the Town, who is the property party in this matter. In fact, receipt of this Default Judgment comes as a complete surprise to my office and is the first time the Town Clerk or my office became aware that a neighboring Court was assigned the matter. It is my understanding that the Court sent a notice of a Court date to the Town of Thompson which was filed with the Town Court and same was not provided to the Town Clerk or the Town attorney. Either way, a Court notice of Court date has little effect if the original Order giving the Court jurisdiction is not served on the required party.

This claim was initially denied by the Town's insurance carrier and ultimately should be defended and indemnified by our insurance carrier. As there are numerous specific defenses for municipalities in these types of matters, the Notice and ability to appear and present statutory legal defenses and immunity to this claim is imperative. In this case specifically the Claimant/Plaintiff did not comply with a timely Notice of Claim within ninety (90) days of the incident, and never made any request from a Court to file a late Notice of Claim. This actually bars the claimant from bringing any action and the Town could not raise such a defense as we did not have a Court to make said Motion in and we were not properly served with the Court Order changing venue.

In any event, we respectfully request the Default Judgment be vacated since the Town has at a minimum a reasonable excuse for not appearing and has a potential meritorious defense and the matter should be set down for another appearance so that the Town can be heard regarding this matter before any final determinations are made.

Good morning Gentlemen,

I am the Race Director of the Rock Hill Run & Ramble, a 5K race that has been staged for the last 31 consecutive years in Rock Hill, NY.

I consulted Bill Rieber and Rich Benjamin, who have always been instrumental to us delivering a safe event, about moving our race to Holiday Mt. I described the new course route and mentioned traffic concerns I had. They pointed me to you, Ed and Ed, to get both your permission and assistance.

#### About the Event: June 15th, 2024 (Race starts at 9 AM)

Our event benefits the Trevor Loughlin Foundation (which issues grants to local patients battling blood cancer and other acute catastrophic illnesses), the Leukemia & Lymphoma Society, and other local charities that support a patient's journey. Over the years we have contributed @1.6million to charity, issued 141 local patient grants (since 2013) and added 760 heroes to the bone marrow bank (since 2008).

We host anywhere between **700-800 runners/walkers** each year (plus some family members who are spectators), and the safety of our event is directly tied to the tremendous support we receive from local law enforcement, first responders, and the Town of Thompson (Sheriff, State Police, Rock Hill Ambulance, Town of Thompson Highway Department, Town of Thompson).


#### **About the New Course:**

We have a new certified course this year (see map attached) which goes from the base lodge at Holiday Mt. out Holiday Mt Rd. to Edwards Rd, and then turns around and comes back.

We need your help in addressing three major traffic concerns we would have on Saturday, June 15<sup>th</sup>, 8:45 – 10 AM. (See my attempt at a traffic map below.)

- 1) Exit 108. We would like to close 108 Bridgeville during the race (Starting at 8:45 AM. Last walker should clear the intersection of Holiday Mt. Rd and Edwards Rd by 10:00 AM)
- 2) Exit 107. We understand that there may be trucks that will need to go to Callahan Industries (across river from Holiday Mt. on Sullivan Rd.) which won't be a problem if they use Exit 107. Rd. and Edwards Rd. until last walker crosses onto Holiday Mt. Rd. (@ 10AM at latest)
- 3) Prevent cars from heading towards the race-course on Edwards Rd. (from Marsh Rd.). The race turnaround point is 212 Edwards Rd. See Course Map attached. (Until @ 10:00 AM)

(There are 9 houses within the 1 mile of Edwards road, and another 5 or so on Holiday Mt. Rd. that we will reach out to in advance to ask them not to drive in or out during the race window. We will also have course marshals on the race course to monitor for cars within that 1.5 mile stretch (lodge to 212 Edwards Rd.) We have experience with this coming from a 3.1 mile course in Rock Hill that went through LLM and Emerald Green)




