The Firefighter that greeted me, I think his name was Justin was quite friendly and a bit perplexed with my dilemma so he went to his Supervisor and when he returned he advised me to keep the phone somewhere out in the open overnight where it wouldn't ignite anything around it and in the morning take it to the Hazardous Waste drop off at the Town's Landfill. So I did.

Golden Ridge is somewhat frustrating for me and the Monticello Fire Fighters. In my opinion there is a good deal of stupidity, carelessness and in some cases accidents from People who can't care for themselves without help. Also there are Tenants who are aged and suffer with carious illnesses. It makes for a near daily Fire/Emergency Call to this complex along with Our Sheriff's Deputies and the NY State Police.

Not since I was a kid, (I'm now 66yo) when three Family Friends were Fire Fighters and one is reknowned NHPD Officer Angelo Appi have I been so impressed with the Equipment and the reliability of our First Responders. Justin was so welcoming and professional as I expect all of our Fire Fighters and EMS are. It made me feel good!
