


BUDGET UPDATE FROM TOWN SUPERVISOR BILL RIEBER

It's time to review our 2025 Town budget and Town happenings (see next page for exciting project updates)! For the 10th consecutive year, tax rates have dropped for our main operating funds and highway repairs without impacting services. We met the NYS tax cap which limits tax increases to 2%. There was again a ZERO dollar levy for the Planning, Zoning and Building Department Services. Financially, we are in a good place. Our General Fund is invested safely and wisely, generating \$1.2M in earnings last year. Taxes are stable and we are steadily growing our tax base with new projects hitting the tax rolls annually. The key takeaway is that without reasonable growth and an increasing tax base we would have to raise taxes. Your Thompson team works hard to improve our quality of life: investing in parks and activities, updating our Comprehensive Plan, keeping your sewer and water facilities in top shape, and maintaining a balanced budget. We attract investment because we are stable, predictable, and always ready to try something new and exciting. Wishing you all a wonderful year full of enjoyment and good health. BREAK DOWN OF GENERAL OPERATING FUNDS




NUMBER OF TOWN DISTRICTS

More Opportunities for Community Fun

We're excited to share even more events and programs for all ages through our Thompson Parks & Recreation Department. Now in its third year, the Thompson Youth Program continues to expand opportunities for youth - including swimming lessons, sports leagues from basketball to flag football, skiing, as well as bus trips to NYC (tickets still available for the March 22nd trip to see the Knicks, details at right!). Finalizing the Thompson Comprehensive Plan

Throughout 2023 and 2024, the Town Comprehensive Plan Committee met to gather community input and craft a framework for how the Town should develop for the future. The committee will submit a draft plan to the Town Board for review this spring and will hold a series of public hearings before adopting the plan. The plan will lay out goals and strategies for managing growth throughout the Town.

Exciting Updates at Town Parks in 2025

Coming soon to East Mongaup River Park and Lake Ida Park...EV chargers will be installed! Also at Lake Ida, look for new bathrooms to open this summer and a series of concerts to be announced. At East Mongaup River Park, you'll see additional changes: Thanks to a Community Impact Grant received from Sullivan 180, the Town will be working with Assemblywoman Paula Kay's office to administer a DASNY grant to develop a dog park and an ADA-accessible playground (see rendering above) at the East Mongaup River Park. This playground will allow residents to use the playground even during YMCA summer camp!

Wrapping Up the LED Lighting Project

This year, we will conclude the LED Lighting Project. Since the project's start, we have installed over 800 LED lights throughout the Town, reducing our carbon footprint and implementing an online system for outages and on-going maintenance.

More Updates to Water & Sewer Infrastructure

The Town has acquired millions in grant funding and no- or low-interest loans to cover muchneeded updates to our water and sewer systems. We will continue to make improvements to these systems in 2025. We will be going to bid this year on major sewer and water projects in Rock Hill/Emerald Green, Kiamesha/Route 42, Sackett Lake and Melody Lake. Total estimated costs are \$55.3 million. Presently, we anticipate \$34.4 million in federal and State grants to offset user costs with the balance financed with mostly 0% loans.

Ongoing Beautification Efforts

Have you noticed the beautiful new banners along Route 42 in Thompson? It's all thanks to 28 local artists of all ages who submitted their work in 2024. Keep an eye out this summer, and you'll see the return of the hanging baskets alongside the new banners. We want to thank our wonderful Parks & Recreation Department for installing the banners and baskets as well as planting new flowers, weeding, and ensuring signage and roundabout green spaces look their best. These intitatives are guided by the Grow the Gateways project, which prioritizes beautification of entryway areas into Thompson so that visitors and residents alike have the best impression of our hometown.

Digitizing Court Records

Starting in 2024, over a million records began to be scanned from the Court Department, including all criminal and civil cases. Recently, our Planning Department underwent the digital archival process, and the benefits have been tremendous. Digital archiving the court records will clear up storage space and scans will be indexed for easy retrieval when documents are needed.
